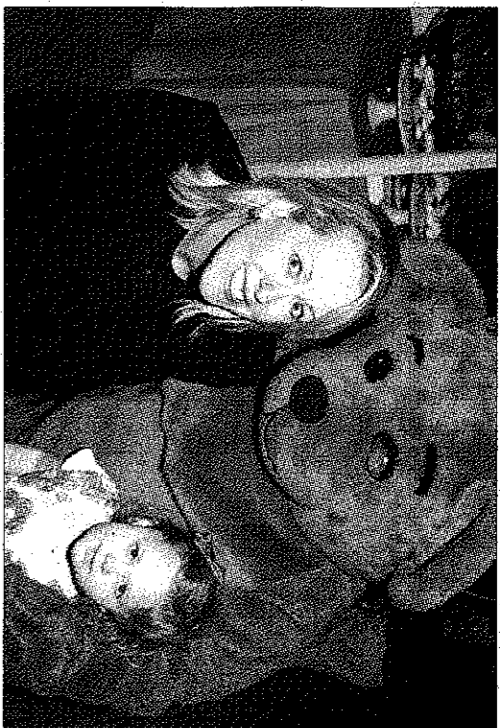

More than \$100,000 was raised for needy families to provide toys, hotel vouchers and other items that children and their families at UCSF Children's Hospital may need during long stays to make the experience a little bit better and more comfortable. The fund was created by Glogau family as an appreciation for the care their son received in 1989. The name was coined when a child arrived without a teddy bear to hug on route to surgery.

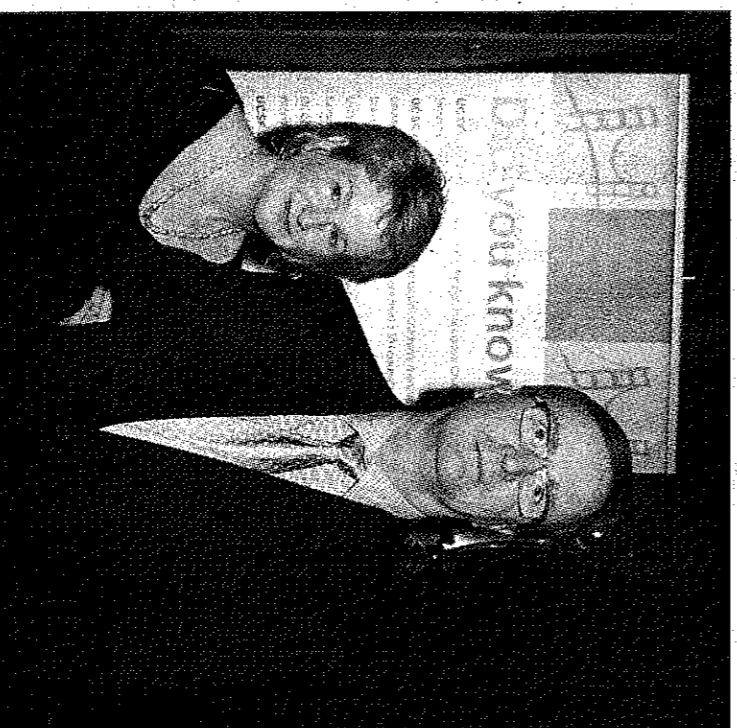
