The fund was dreamed up nine years ago by Dr. **Richard Glogau** and his wife, **Pam Baj Glogau**, to provide basic comforts for pediatric patients and their families.

Comforts both large, and small, such as taxi vouchers, cafeteria meals, shelter, gas money, seeing-eye dogs, heart medication and ... teddy bears.

In support of the Glogaus, **Ann** and **Gordon Getty** have opened their home for the past six years for their friends' fundraiser, which has helped increase the fund's overall take to almost a cool mil.

Star Radio host **Don Bleu** emceed a pre-party program with honorary event co-chairs, skater **Kristi Yamaguchi** and her husband, former NHL defenseman **Bret Hedican**.
