A BEAR OF A HUG FOR TEDDY FUND

Guests large and small alighted at an elegant kiddie carnival last month during the annual Snuggly Soiree fun-raiser hosted by philanthropists **Ann** and **Gordon Getty** in their Gold Coast manse.

Well-dressed tots careened around the marble courtyard set up with myriad delights from face painting to gourmet fairground food cooked up by Getty chef **Jennifer Johnson** as their folks raised \$200K in support of the Glogau Teddy Bear Rescue Fund at UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital.

Even Ann Getty couldn't resist the lure of a spin on a carnival-style motorcycle ride, expertly racing a few rounds against a determined 10-year-old.

Founded 11 years ago by **Pam Glogau** and her husband, Dr. **Richard Glogau**, the fund recently surpassed

the \$1 million mark in providing basic comforts (including food, transportation, housing, medications and teddy bears) not covered by insurance for UCSF's pediatric patients and their families.

Among the revelers: UCSF School of Medicine Dean Dr. **Sam Hawgood**; **Debby** and **Peter Magowan** and their son and daughter-in-law **Matthew** and **Jennifer Cook**; **Ron Conway**; **Carole** and **Bob McNeil**; **Pamela** and **Ted Deikel**; **Laurie** and **Bill Hake**; and UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital Executive Director **Kimberly Scurr**.

The bottom line was assisted by a luxurious lineup of silent-auction goodies including VIP tickets to the **Madonna** concert, an S.F. Giants-Dodgers baseball package, and a high-tech, grilled cheese lunch for 10 with **MC Ham-**

mer at **Jonathan Kaplan's** Melt restaurant.

And it turns out that Hammer, who recently celebrated his 50th birthday at a party hosted by Conway at the Tonga Room, not only knows how to dance — he knows from kids, too.

"I have six kids, so I understand the needs of families," said the rapper. "I had a premature baby 6½ years ago and met a lot of families during that extended time at the hospital. So it's great to see events like this one focused on helping families and kids."

Magic serenade: There was a serious dilemma at the Fairmont Hotel during the San Francisco Opera Guild's Evening of Enchantment gala on March 23: Guests were torn between bidding on a Paris Fashion Week trip or vying for a dinner

Magic, indeed. As the gala also benefited the Opera Guild's arts and education programs, which helps some 55,000 students throughout Northern California discover their voices.
